Science – Year 1

- Go on a senses walk – what things can you see, hear, smell, touch and taste. Decide how you want to record this.
- Stand in your garden and close your eyes. Write down all the things you can hear and smell.

Creative

- Stand at a window in your house – Sketch what you can see outside. Choose how you add colour to this.

Science – Year 2

- Create a habitat for an animal of your choice. This could be junk modelling or a drawing. Can you include all the things it will need to survive?
- Design a healthy meal for a human. You could cook this with your family and take pictures, write a recipe or draw a picture of it.

Design and Technology

- Use construction toys or junk modelling to create a model of a local building or one you have seen in a local

- Explore mixing colours- this could be paint, layering pencil or felt tip pens or natural objects in the garden. What different colours can you make?

town or city. Talk about how the building is different to your house.

- Design a fantasy building. What would you have inside? What will the building look like on the outside?

Maths

- We are learning to represent numbers in different ways. Can you use objects in your house to represent numbers? Eg, pairs of shoes lined up to represent 12 or Lego bricks grouped in 5's to make 25. You could draw a picture or take a photograph.

English

- Draw a picture of your family and write a few sentences about them.
- Choose your favourite book and think of an alternative story. Can you design a front cover for the new book?

Geography

- Draw a map of your garden. What features can you add? Can you draw it as if you are in the sky looking down?
- Go for a walk around your local area – draw pictures of the different things you spot. These might be natural or man-made features.
